May could be marked as a month of forthcoming anniversaries. D-Day, the Allied invasion to France, 70th anniversary will come in June and centenary anniversary of the World War I or the Great War will be celebrated in summer. We decided to commemorate both of these anniversaries. The first one by two kits featuring invasion stripes in 1/72 and 1/48 scales. For the Great War centenary in the summer we will release a 1/32 scale kit of a Bristol M.1C fighter. And that's not all. Except of these anniversary kits you'll be bale to order other two kits. At the end of May or in the beginning of June the distribution of the long awaited 1/72 scale AH-1G Cobra kit will start, so far in two boxes. Nevertheless, this kit deserves special newsletter in which we will inform about its release. Now back to the forthcoming kits...

SH48128 Supermarine Seafire Mk.III "D-Day Fleet Eyes" 1/48 Bar Code: 8594071084363

Seafire Mk.III was the best naval fighter of British design to enter the WW 2. Even thought the fragile undercarriage was a slight handicap of this aircraft in the air it was formidable opponent. German, Italian and even at the end of the War the Japanese pilots could see it for themselves. Seafires were deployed not only as fighters. Seafires of the No.3 Naval Fighter Wing were based at the South England airfields and flew sorties to the Normandy beaches.




The sorties were flown in pairs and directed the invasion fleet's battleship fire. It was a dangerous work since the low flying machines were endangered by both AA fire and enemy fighters.

The kit offers two machines from No.3 Naval Fighter Wing with the invasion stripes applied. The first one is particularly interesting since when its tail planes were replaced they were painted by base grey-green colour. Two pilots were successful in aerial combat with enemy fighters. In the contrary, the second machine illustrate how dangerous was the battleship fire control mission. This machine was shot up and forced to emergency land in the enemy territory on the second

day. The pilot successfully crossed the frontline and returned to its unit.

The kit contains five sprues with grey plastic parts, injected canopy, photo-etched parts and self adhesive masks.



The light bombers designated A-20
Havoc in US and Boston in British air forces formed a significant part of the Tactical Bomber Air Force deployed prior and during the invasion. RAF used Bostons from No.88 Squadron flew sorties to deploy the smokescreen. These machines had the stripes similar to the invasion ones applied already in 1943 during the fictive invasion
Operation Starkey. We decided to



add one Boston in the Starkey Operation camouflage featuring the smoke generators. But the kit offers tru invasion machines. Highly successful RH-B machine from RAF No.88 Squadron decorated with beer keg painting and mission markings and two machines from No.342 "Lorraine" Squadron (GB 1/20 Lorraine) of the Free French Air Force. One of them carried British roundels the other had the French already applied.

The kit contains five sprues with grey plastic parts, injected clear parts and resin cast smoke generators' pipes.





US T-33A machines became the world's widely used jet trainer aircraft. The list of its users is impressively long. The service career of this aircraft cannot be included on one decal sheet of one kit. We had to choose the most interesting, particularly from the machines that served in Europe. We chose US, German, French and Dutch machines. US 57. FIS. machine was deployed to Iceland and during its service its camouflage changed from multi coloured one with mouth painting


on its nose to overall grey with red markings and black and white checkers. German machine from JG71 sports Hartman's tulip painting on the nose. The French machine is of note for its fancy coloured fin that featured marking of several units tha machine subsequently served with. Even the relatively sober camouflaged Dutch machine was fancy coloured with colour markings, as the trainer machine should be.

Huge box contains six sprues with grey plastic parts, injected clear parts (part of them is injected from metal mould), detailed resin parts, coloured photo-etched fret and three A5 format decal sheets.

Similarly to other states, to enforce its air force prior the World War 2 Netherlands ordered aircraft in the USA. Among other ordered aircraft, order was placed for Douglas DB-8A-3N. It was Northrop Co. original design that was purchased by Douglas. The successful Northrop/ Douglas machines, in various versions differing in engines and fixed or retractable landing gears (and thus the designation), were purchased not only by USAAF but also by couple of European, South American and Asian countries. According to the specifications the Dutch machines were powered by R-1820 engines. Although the original purpose was bombing missions, the Dutch machines were deployed as bomber interceptors; therefore DB-8A-3N victory count lists several German bombers. Several machines survived the occupation of Netherlands and were seized by Luftwaffe that used them for tests and training.



This limited edition kit offers marking for one of the German trainer aircraft. This machine features complete German insignias and sports Luftwaffe Trainer School emblem below the canopy.




MPM Production continues to prepare its kits completely in 3D design and inject them into metal moulds. Some of the kits are already on sale *A4/V2* rockets, *SS-100 Gigant* tractor and *Meillerwagen* rocket trailer. We present the test shots of the final kits of *AH-1G Cobra*, *AH-1Q/S Cobra* and day fighter versions of *DH 100 Vampire*. Both Vampire and Cobras in quality exceed every kit of these subjects that was in 1/72 scale ever produced. Now it's time to reveal our next project. We had already started to prepare moulds for trainer aircraft *Fouga Magister* and its versions. We will, subsequently release *CM 170 Magister* in both trainer and combat version (including *IDF Tzukit*), aerobatics version with faired over rear canopy and even *CM 175 Zéphyr* naval version. The differences from the standard Magisters comprise lengthened fuselage, different canopy, arrestor hook and strengthened undercarriage.










Napier Sabre series Mk.II - WW II British aircraft engine

Production engines were installed to the Hawker Typhoon and Tempest fighters. Almost identical Sabre Mk.III powered the Blackburn Firebrand Mk.I attack planes. Sabre engines were also installed in the Hawker Fury and Martin-Baker MB-3 prototypes and test-flown in the Fo 108 and Warwick machines.




Typhoon Mk.I - Engine set for Airfix kit








Fuel Storage Tank Container - full resine kit






