In our July newsletter we 'd like to offer you two pairs of models that have been eagerly awaited for a long time by the modellers public. The long time we took for their preparation reflects in the improved quality of all these models. This will certainly affect their increased sales and popularity among modellers.

The first two models are AH-1G Cobras in 1/72 scale. MPM Production company have intended couple of years to make a model of this iconic helicopter. Realization of this model has been postponed for a long time, it was deciced to start it when the transition to new technology of model-making (3D modelling used for the design and CNC machining of the metal moulds) has been mastered. The result is a model that outclasses any competition with level of its details, ease of the assembly and overall accuracy. And it is important to mention that during the model preparations also Vietnam War veterans and their family members were involved. We offer you these two boxings:


SH72274 AH-1G Cobra "Spanish and IDF Cobras"

This model contains two camouflages of Spanish Navy machines and two of the Israeli Defence Force. While both of the Israeli Cobras are in usual Olive colour, that of the Spanish Navy are Dark Blue overall. Interesting is also that their armament remained in Olive usually. Such colourful machines are certainly attractive for modellers. Besides complete markings on the decal sheet, there is also another sheet of decals containing all needed stencils, including also those for the armament.

The model consists of five grey plastic frames with highly detailed and finely engraved parts. In a frame of clear parts you will find a gunsight, nose and under-fuselage lights and a cockpit greenhouse split to five parts, which means you can build your Cobra with either closed or open canopy. The instructions are printed in full colour, as is the new standard of MPM Production.



There are the same frames as in model SH72274, but it contains also a resin dummy turret for a training Cobra. The decal sheet enables modellers to choose one of five US machines in six different markings (one Cobra is depicted in two different stages of its service-life). The machines we have put to the instructions saw action over the US or Europe during the height of the Cold War. There are rather attractive markings, not only the box-top


machine with a shark mouth, but also a cobra-head


emblem adorned Cobra, two different training machines whose fuselage wore colourful red-orange markings and a machine that was used for various weapons tests. The instructions are in our new full-colour standard.





Even though the model itself is highly detailed, we have prepared also colour photo etched parts for modellers seeking even higher level of detail. In the set you will find such details for the cockpit as the instrument panels and seat-belts and also many various exterior parts including the Remove Before Flight tags. This set can be used also

with the future Cobra boxings.

For our AH-1G Cobra models, there are also available cast resin seats for the pilot and gunner. The seats were designed in the 3D and the master models were printed using our 3D printer. They offer much more details than the plastic ones.




The other of the announced pair of models is the F-86K Sabre Dog in 1/48 scale. The F-86K Sabre Dog was an all-weather version of the F-86D fighter and was built for European NATO-members. The F-86K had different longer fuselage and cannon armament. Most of the planes had longer span wings identical with that of the following F-86L version. The majority of the planes were built by Fiat in Italy, although few tens of them were built also by North American. The F-86K served in air forces of Italy, the Netherlands, France, Norway and Germany. The model is offered in following boxings:

SH48123 F-86K Sabre Dog "NATO All Weather Fighter" 1/48

There are three main sprues of grey plastic in this model plus a frame of clear parts, resin parts and a set of photoetched parts. The decal sheet contains markings for three natural-metal machines, the Italian and Dutch ones have squadron badges on their tails. Most colourful is the Norwegian plane, adorned with a shark mouth and a sketch of a dog named Laika. There is also a plenty of stencils, they are various for all of the three machines. 54868



MPM Production continues to prepare its kits completely in 3D design and inject them into metal moulds. Some of the kits are already on sale *A4/V2* rockets, *SS-100 Gigant* tractor and *Meillerwagen* rocket trailer. We present the test shots of the final kits of *AH-1G Cobra*, *AH-1Q/S Cobra* and day fighter versions of *DH 100 Vampire*. Both Vampire and Cobras in quality exceed every kit of these subjects that was in 1/72 scale ever produced. Now it's time to reveal our next project. We had already started to prepare moulds for trainer aircraft *Fouga Magister* and its versions. We will, subsequently release *CM 170 Magister* in both trainer and combat version (including *IDF Tzukit*), aerobatics version with faired over rear canopy and even *CM 175 Zéphyr* naval version. The differences from the standard Magisters comprise lengthened fuselage, different canopy, arrestor hook and strengthened undercarriage.
